Saint ALBERT, Patriarch of Jerusalem and Lawgiver of the Order of Carmelites

Optional memorial

Albert was Bishop of Bobbio and Vercelli (Piedmont) where for nearly twenty years he worked for peace and conversion of hearts. He was asked by the Canons Regular of the Holy Sepulchre to take charge of the Jerusalem Patriarchate and Pope Innocent III appointed him Legate of Palestine (1205) where he arrived in 1206. The Muslims did not allow him to enter Jerusalem, so he established his residence in St. Jean d'Acre, from where he was able to act on behalf of the Pope with wisdom, prudence and vigour. About 1208-1209 it was he who gave the hermits of Mount Carmel their first Rule at the request of their first Prior, St Burchard. This Rule, approved by Pope Honorius III in 1226, is an important document for the spirituality of the Middle Ages, focusing on the spirit of prayer, meditation on the Word of God and detachment so as to live closer to God. Albert died on 14 September 1214, foully murdered during a procession to St. Jean d'Acre.

St. Albert was a faithful preacher of the Word and, after the example of St. Paul, «he became all things to all so as to save some, at any price». He did not hesitate to lay down his life, in imitation of Christ, thus fulfilling the words of the psalm ; «Here I am, Lord, I come to do your will» (Ps 39).

FIRST READING

A reading from the first letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians 9: 16-19, 22-23

Brethren, if I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it! If I do so willingly, I have a recompense, but if unwillingly, then I have been entrusted with a stewardship. What then is my recompense? That, when I preach, I offer the gospel free of charge so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel. Although I am free in regard to all, I have made myself a slave to all so as to win over as many as possible. To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak. I have become all things to all, to save at least some. All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it.
