THE FINDING OF THE CROSS

In the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre: Feast

Elsewhere: Optional Memorial

About the discovery of the Cross, we have some evidence dating back to the 4th century, and particularly that of St. Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem, in his Catechesis (IV 10: 19 X: XIII 4). He claims that in 347, the relics of the Holy Cross were distributed throughout the churches of Christ. It is therefore possible that the discovery of the Cross took place, actually, into 326, at the time of Empress Helena's pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

The liturgy of this day presents the Cross, already represented by the Bronze Serpent in the desert (Num 21), as a sign of hope for all men. An object of scorn, the Cross of Christ has become our "pride". Following Christ, we too must enter into the Paschal Mystery, and live out His Passion so as to offer to the world the testimony of His Resurrection.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: cf. Gal 6: 14

May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.

[When this feast occurs on a day not a Sunday, there is only one reading before the Gospel; outside the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre there is only one reading]

COLLECT

Lord, by the discovery of the Cross, the source of salvation, you taught us to venerate the Paschal Mystery of your Son.

Graciously grant that by sharing his Cross, we may also share in his Resurrection.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Numbers 21: 4-9

On the Red Sea road, with their patience worn out by the journey, the people complained against God and Moses, "Why have you brought us up from Egypt to die in this desert, where there is no food or water? We are disgusted with this wretched food!" In punishment the LORD sent among the people fiery serpents, which bit the people so that many of them died. Then the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned in complaining against the LORD and you. Pray the LORD to take the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people, and the LORD said to Moses, "Make a fiery serpent and mount it on a pole, and if anyone who has been bitten looks at it, he will recover. Moses accordingly made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole, and whenever anyone who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, he recovered.
